

Laryssa Doohovskoy

A passionate teacher and educator, Laryssa Doohovskoy has over 15 years' experience as a teacher of both children and adults. She runs a thriving private studio in Acton, MA, is on the faculty of the Synod of School of Liturgical Music, teaches voice at the Middlesex School in Concord, MA, and is Director of the Vocal Program for the Patriarch Tikhon Russian American Music Institute (PaTRAM) Summer Academy. She is also a member of the National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS). As an active clinician, she frequently works with singers and choirs alike in masterclasses and workshops and has served as an adjudicator for local and national competitions. In 2012, Ms. Doohovskoy was appointed Music Director of the St. Xenia Orthodox Church in Methuen, MA where she leads both the adult and children's choirs.

Ms. Doohovskoy began her professional performance career over 20 years ago and has performed under the baton of many notable conductors including Wolfgang Sawallisch, Ricardo Muti, Sean Deibler, David Hayes, Christopher Hogworth, Tamara Brooks, and Jo-Michael Scheibe.

Ms. Doohovskoy is a frequent chamber music collaborator throughout the Greater Boston area, performing classical, musical theatre, and new music programs.

In 2019, she participated in the tour of Benedict Sheehan's Divine Liturgy with the St. Tikhon Choir. As a member of the PaTRAM Singers, she joined Peter Jermihov in the 2017 world premiere of Kurt Sander's Divine Liturgy. In 2015, she participated in the recording of the Rachmaninov All-Night Vigil under the direction of Maestro Jermihov. In December of 2014, she recorded with the Patriarch Tikhon Choir on the CD Praise the Lord All Ye Nations. In 2013, she recorded Full of Grace: Great Vespers for the Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos with members of the St. Vladimir's Seminary Chorale, under the direction of Robin Freeman. Ms. Doohovskoy earned her undergraduate degree from New England Conservatory. She continued her studies in South Florida, earning a graduate degree from the University of Miami Frost School of Music.
